## LITTLE BIRDHOUSE PURSE

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
 Cut out fabric with seam allowance for the outer side
 Bast them over cardboard
 Sew them together

Cut out fabric and batting with seam allowance for **the inner side**Bast them over cardboard





- Cut a strip fabric of 2.5 x 5 cm + batting 1 x 5 cm
   Glue fabric around the batting
- Insert the D-ring into the center of the strip and fold it





• Place strip with D-ring on one roof pitch





- Sew the two outer sides together with the D-ring in between
- Remove the cardboard and turn the right side out



Put the slider on the zipper
 Sew the two inner sides to
 the zipper
 The pages are located
 approx. in the middle of the
 fabric on the zipper
 NOTE THE ZIPPER FACES
 DOWN...

The sides are sewn onto the wrong side of the zipper ...

 Sew over the zipper approx. 0.5 cm out and cut away the zipper that is too much





Remove the cardboard



 Insert the inner part into the outer part Make sure they face the same (the sides are not the same height...)

Fold in the seam allowance on the outer part

Appliqué the bottom down to the zipper just above the stitching which the inner part is sewn



- Gather some yarn and sew a button on top
- Now the little purse is finished
  Have fun with the little birdhouse purse



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
